## Summer School on European Business and Culture

Fachhochschule Bielefeld - University of Applied Sciences  
May 9 - June 17, 2011



The European Summer School combines the unique opportunity to discover Europe with the chance to take an active part in a 6 week structured course at the University of Applied Sciences in Bielefeld. Bielefeld with its 325,000 inhabitants is the largest city of the Ostwestfalen-Lippe district in North Rhine-Westphalia and the economic center of the region.

This well coached and diversified course offers an exciting possibility for open-minded students to immerse themselves in political and social trends within Europe. Contents of the lectures are arranged with alternations instead of only lectures. There will be classes (in English) on European Culture and Cross-Cultural Management and on European Politics and Business, and also language classes in German. Three multiday-field trips are part of the program: Berlin including a visit of the German parliament, Frankfurt including a visit of the European Central Bank and Brussels as the "capital" of the European Union. Furthermore, visits to regionally located, but worldwide acting companies are offered. The group will consist of students from North-America as well as from Germany and other European countries to make the experience even more rewarding. The aim is to cultivate a fundamental capacity for understanding unfamiliar and familiar cultures and an ability to interpret "difference" in the cultural contexts with pleasure.

Participants of the Summer School will earn credit points, feedback of their performance in class, a mid term exam as well as an exam at the end of the course.

## Heidelberg Summer School

### SRH University Heidelberg

Session I: May 22 - June 11; Session II: June 19 - July 09, 2011



SRH University Heidelberg is a private university with an exceptional program in Business Administration, offering an academic environment for learning in an international and intercultural context. This course includes history, geography, education, cross-cultural issues, German identity and intercultural competence. Also included: basic "Survival German" to gain language skills for daily use. Exciting excursions: European Parliament/Strasbourg, Porsche, Munich (optional), Paris (optional), SAP, a German brewery, a Heidelberg city tour. Outstanding cultural and sports program and other organized leisure activities. Total of 12 ECTS (6 semester credits).

The program is open to students who have completed their first year of undergraduate studies. It is especially designed for motivated students with a major or minor in business and an interest in German and European culture.

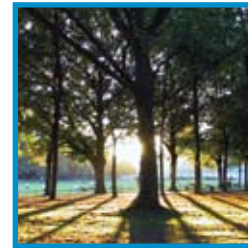

## Renewable Energy: Policy and Development

### University of Bonn

June 1 - August 5, 2011



The University of Bonn, Northwestern and Arcadia Universities invite excellent American undergraduates from various academic backgrounds to a new interdisciplinary program on renewable energies. The program introduces students to numerous facets of renewable energy policy and development as responses to today's climate and energy problems and students explore and discuss technologies and their implications with professionals.

Bonn is closely associated with renewable energy and a hub for institutions in the field, such as 16 UN agencies and international think tanks. Participants benefit from the University's broad experience in hosting international students and from all University facilities and amenities. Student "Buddies" from Bonn make this a truly German experience.

The program combines five components:

- The Course "Energy Policy: Global Decisions, Local Actors" focuses on the „energy“ factor of global efforts of policy-making towards sustainable development. Starting with a large scale perspective on policies and global actors, it then introduces students to the EU's approach including a visit the European Commission in Brussels. The focus then shifts to US and German efforts in the field and to concrete examples of local action during the last week in Bonn. Students put what they learned to use in a simulation, in a larger discussion, and in their final papers.
- Guest lectures from and excursions to NGOs, research institutions like the National Research Center Jülich, and renewable energy sites will deepen the students' policy knowledge and cover the technological, economic and cultural side of the topic.
- Students will work in small groups on energy related group projects, guided by scientists and professionals from the respective fields.
- The program is conducted in English but students take a class on German culture and language.
- During five days in Berlin the group will meet with practitioners and politicians from government agencies and NGOs and get further insights into recent German history and culture.

## ENGINEERING INTERNSHIPS

Leibniz Universität Hannover (LUH) and TU Clausthal (TUC)  
(University of Hanover and Clausthal University of Technology)  
June 6 to July 29, 2011



The program emerged in 2008 from a rewarding partnership with the DAAD and has since continued to be a very successful endeavour. Student enrolment from Purdue and participating ISEP universities in the United States and Canada has steadily increased.

As a two-month summer internship program it is an ideal complement to most American and Canadian degree programs requiring research, laboratory, experiential learning or foreign language credit hours. Students in the program conduct research under the direction of a faculty member at either Leibniz University Hannover or Clausthal University of Technology. Students may describe their research interests and be placed in a suitable department based on their description or choose to participate in an existing proposal offered by one of the university departments. There are 30 placements available for this program, 15 per university

The traditional focus of the program has been on all aspects of mechanical engineering.

The program is in English.

Our goal is to create a talented and diverse class that is best suited to take advantage of the opportunities and resources provided by an education at Hannover and Clausthal.

Each week students participate in 28 hours of research, eight hours of German language classes, and hours of discussion with faculty and other students on their research projects at the conclusion of the program.

While originally designed specifically to accommodate the mechanical engineering project at Purdue University, part of the BSME degree curriculum, and Purdue University's Global Engineering Studies Minor, students from other universities are of course very welcome to apply.

Participants receive six credits in mechanical engineering description and three credits in German language -

### Requirements

Applicants must be in at least their second year of an undergraduate or graduate level degree in engineering or science to be eligible.

Applicants may describe their research interests and be placed in a suitable department based on their description or choose to participate in an existing proposal offered by one of the university departments.

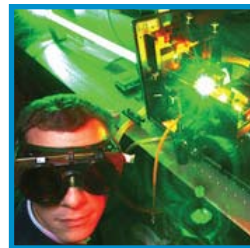

## Dortmund International Summer Program (ISP) Technische Universität Dortmund (TU Dortmund University) June - July/August 2011 (see website for exact dates)



TU Dortmund University is part of the Ruhr Academic Triangle, in the heart of one of Europe's most important metropolitan areas. The International Summer Program (ISP) is designed to offer excellent students innovative, hands-on study opportunities in upcoming fields - including project work - designed to build your resume and experience, extend your network, and give you a unique European/ transnational set of skills in your field of study. Credits will transfer directly to your home institution after a successful completion of the program.

### Program Features

The ISP consists of two different tracks you can choose from: Engineering (Track A) and German and European Studies (Track B). You have to decide in which field you want to study, but you are welcome to take courses from the other track as well. In addition to the elected courses, students are required to take part in a German language & culture course.

- **Research Project:** Qualified students can elect to take part in an optional research project. The work-load for this project is 1-2 days per week in addition to regular studies, followed by 2 weeks of full-time research after the exam period. Successful completion will result in additional credits and a certificate.
- **Language of Instruction:** All courses are in English, yet students are encouraged to use this opportunity to acquire German language skills. A unique feature of the ISP is that you will participate in regular classes, with German and other international Dortmund students, broadening and expanding your social and career network.
- **Service and Support:** TU Dortmund University takes pride in its comprehensive program for international students. This includes train station pick up, dormitory accommodation, orientation, and dedicated 1-to-1 advising before, during, and after the study period. Excursions, travel advice, and a monthly regional transport ticket are provided to all students.

### Requirements

The program is designed mainly for students in the third or fourth year of study and is also suitable for graduate students.

### Program Cost

€1400 for accommodation for June & July, tuition fees, health insurance, public transport ticket, cultural program, excursions, and German language course. For students from partner universities, the fee is reduced to €1160.

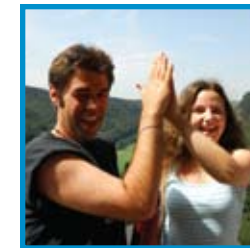

## On the Cutting Edge of Sustainable Energy Supply

TU Bergakademie Freiberg  
May 23 until June 24, 2011



Since 2004 the Technische Universität Bergakademie Freiberg offers a five-week interdisciplinary summer course in sustainable energy technology. Students shall be acquainted with the most recent technological developments related to the use of sustainable energies as well as current widely-used technological solutions, e.g. Photovoltaics, Fuel Cell Technology, Hydrogen Storage Technology, Solar Thermal Technologies, Heat Pumps, Geothermal Energy Use, Energy Use of Waste Materials, New Hydro Power, Wind Energy Basics, Biogas and Energy from Agricultural Raw Materials. Excursions to relevant companies and research institutions are an important part of the course. The course is taught in English. The course also involves lectures on German history and culture. The academic course is accompanied by an extensive cultural program featuring weekend trips to Berlin and Prague, day trips to Dresden and the Freiberg mountain region as well as concerts, sports events and a day in a German family. Participants may gain basic communication skills in German or improve their German language skills in a German language course that is part of the Summer School program.

### Requirements

The course is open to participants over the age of 18 who are fluent in English. The course is primarily designed for undergraduates students (3./4. year) or recent graduates. The number of participants is limited to 20.

### Program Cost

€2500. Includes tuition, accommodation, cultural activities, bicycles, German language classes. For students from partner universities the tuition fee is waived. The course fee of € 1.500 includes accommodation, bicycles, cultural activities and German language classes. A registration fee will not be charged. A limited number of scholarships is available. Costs for visa, overseas travel, travelling in Europe after the end of the course, food and insurance has to be paid for by the students themselves.

## Munich Summer School of Applied Sciences

Munich University of Applied Sciences

July 11 - August 12, 2011



This summer academy is run by the Munich University of Applied Sciences, one of the most attractive universities and the second largest of its kind in Germany. The Munich Summer School of Applied Sciences embraces an in-depth study in the fields Engineering and Business Administration. It is application-orientated, teaching state-of-the-art technology.

- Program Structure and Academic Content: The summer academy is scheduled for five weeks. Students with no or few German language skills take an intensive language and culture course the first week and part-time throughout the study program. Students will select two credit courses that are taught in English by multinational teams of two renowned lecturers and comprise aspects of sustainability and green technology issues. The courses planned are:
  - Automotive Mechatronics
  - Design of Lightweight Structure
  - Renewable Energies
  - International Management
  - Innovation & Entrepreneurship.

All courses will be assessed so as to best enable students to receive credits for the program at their home university. For this reason, the academic program has been developed in collaboration with California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo.

- Additional Program Features: Munich University of Applied Sciences guarantees professional assistance for participants of the summer school. ## International Summer Program for Automotive Engineering

University of Duisburg-Essen

June 06 - August 12, 2011



The University of Duisburg-Essen (UDE) is located in the Rhein-Ruhr Region, one of the largest urban areas in Europe with a high density of educational institutions. In addition to the 12 international master programs, the University of Kassel (Uni Kassel) offers two short-term programs each year: the International Summer University (ISU) and the International Winter University (IWU) to promote the strengths of Uni Kassel in Environmental Sciences and German Language & Culture. The first ISU was organized in 2001 as an internationalization initiative of Uni Kassel. Once a pioneer of international short-term programs in Germany, ISU inspired the establishment of IWU in 2005/06 in response to growing interest of international students to study in Germany. Both ISU and IWU are now overseen by Uni Kassel's International Study Centre and share the motto: "Sustainable Environment Cultural Heritage Student Potential WE CARE".

Today, there are many short-term programs in Germany and around the world. The uniqueness of ISU and IWU lies in our concern for the sustainability of global environment and cultural heritage and our care for the students' potential and needs while studying abroad. While we embrace globalization and innovation in the study program, the best practices of IWU and ISU have been kept to ensure that the visiting students are fully engaged in the local community and culture during their short stay in Kassel. Students are arranged to live with carefully selected host families and practise their classroom knowledge with tandem partners and tutors. Workshops (e.g. German dancing, cooking, sports), field trips and excursions in Kassel and neighboring areas are also organized to introduce local culture and traditions to the students outside classrooms. The theme "sustainability" does not only cover the academic content of ISU and IWU, but also the program design which encourages continuous learning within and outside classrooms.

### International Summer University (ISU) Kassel June 18 - July 16, 2011

The International Summer University (ISU) Kassel started as one of the Hessen International Summer Universities that have been designed to attract international students to Hessen. Established in 2001, ISU offers short-term credit-bearing academic program featuring the strengths of Uni Kassel in the areas of Environmental Sciences and German Language & Culture studies. Apart from the academic components with specific foci, ISU is unique in its host-family program for students to experience first-hand German lifestyle. The University's long-standing partnerships with industries in the region and experiences in university-industry knowledge transfer also bring additional benefit to ISU students by giving them opportunities to witness the application of academic knowledge in industrial settings.

Since its inception, ISU has brought some 50 international students to Kassel every year. ### International Winter University (IWU) Kassel December 29, 2010 - January 19, 2011

Following the success of ISU, the International Winter University (IWU) Kassel was established in 2005/06 to offer international students an alternative timeframe to experience education in Germany. It is a pioneer of short-term winter programs in Germany and is one of the short-term programs bearing the DAAD Quality Seal.

Since its inception, IWU has received on average some 50 international students each year. The number of students is on the rise with its growing popularity among partnering universities. In 2009/2010, a total of 59 students took part in the program.

#### Program of Study - IWU Kassel

Students will be awarded 6 ECTS upon completion of the German language course and the engineering module or culture module. Classes are taught by selected faculty members in English. Students of the engineering program will be arranged to visit industrial partners and students from the cultural modules the museums and cultural establishments in Kassel.

#### 1. German Language Course (30 Contact Hours, 2 ECTS credits)

The German language courses are designed to meet the criteria of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (European Language Portfolio) at the following levels: A1, B1 and C1. Students will study in small groups under the supervision of experienced teachers qualified in teaching German as a foreign language. Interactive and innovative teaching methods are characteristics of the German language course offered by IWU Kassel.

## 2. Environmental Engineering Module (45 Contact Hours, 4 ECTS credits / seminar)

The seminar includes field trips and will cover the following topics:

- An introduction to international climate policy
- Renewable energy and energy systems from a German and European perspective
- Environment protection measures

## Hessen International Summer University (ISU)

Philipps-Universität Marburg

July 25 - August 19, 2011



The Hessen International Summer University (ISU) in Marburg is a four-week summer term program. On the topic "Peace and Conflict. Near and Middle East - A European Perspective" the ISU University will approach the topic from the perspective of political science, sociology, history, cultural and regional studies. The courses are offered in German and English. The basic program consists of two courses (18 contact hours each) and the language course (36 contact hours).

Another program highlight is our diverse extracurricular program: It consists of day trips to nearby sites, lectures by well-known people in politics, economics and science, and an opening and farewell banquet. An additional asset for North American students is the fact that the ISU usually hosts participants from around twenty nations and professors from all over the world. Thus, our North American students do not feel as if they were part of an island program with students exclusively from their own country. Due to the mix of students, the ISU Marburg team is well acquainted with hosting students from North America. A positive and valuable effect of the ISU has been the inclusion of the program in the university's exchange program as well as students coming back for longer studies in Marburg or Hessen

Since the 19th century, seven Million emigrants have undertaken the journey from the harbour in Bremerhaven, Germany to the United States. This major pathway of immigration is the main focus of this summer program on the history of emigration and the role of Bremen and Bremerhaven.

We will visit the German Emigration Center in Bremerhaven and learn more about the destiny of the emigrants in the last centuries. You will be able to track down your own family history as a part of extended project work.

Lecturers from different departments of the university will teach topics such as German history, history of emigration, integration and multicultural issues and much more. In addition, German language courses (A1 and A2 level based on your language needs) are a part of the program.

Considerable time will be given to individual project work on your own family history or the destiny of other emigrants.

Total classroom hours: 100 hrs

Language hours: 45 hrs

History classes and project work: 55 hours

Bremen is a cosmopolitan and multicultural city with a 1200-year-history. It is home to some 500,000 people. The University of Bremen was founded in 1971 and has around 18,000 students.
